## In Preparation for Sunday

Sometimes it's way too easy to become negative. It seems everywhere we look we see wars and divisions, natural disasters and suffering. If we focus on the trouble too long our own hearts can become fatigued. Fear and frustrations might push aside hope and comfort which can make it hard to imagine a world made right again. Yet, through the prophet Isaiah we are offered God's promise:

"For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind."

(Isa. 65:17)

This word was originally spoken to the Jewish people returning home from Babylonian exile. They would need to find their way, start over, rebuild. And God's promise was for their present reality, but also for their and our future. God's promises are as relevant today as they were then. ### Message from Bishop Carter

To the People of the Western North Carolina Conference of The United Methodist Church:

The 2024 General Conference delegates approved four Constitutional

Amendments that came before annual conferences across the world for consideration. The Western North Carolina Conference voted on them at annual conference in June, 2025. <u>Today the Council of Bishops announced that each amendment passed with more than 90% support worldwide.</u> While these amendments will be incorporated into our Book of Discipline in 2028, they take effect immediately.

The overwhelming passage of these Constitutional Amendments gives me great hope for our church and its present and future mission in sharing the gospel with all people. The new constitution honors who we are as a worldwide denomination, and understands that our mission in Europe, the Philippines, Africa and the United States is contextual. In this way it allows United Methodists to best serve their unique communities.

The amendments help us to relate to each other on a more equal basis while allowing us to continue to connect and be in ministry with each other around the world. The language moves away from a United States-centered church, with outposts around the world, to a truly worldwide denomination with each region able to make some independent decisions. We have clearer language that prohibits the exclusion of persons because of gender or ability. And our constitution now includes an honest confession of the church's role in racism, colonialism inequity, and privilege. Each is rooted in our conviction that every person is created in the image of God.

Our denomination now has 8 regional conferences. Each will have the authority to maximize the effectiveness of their mission and ministry by adapting portions of the Book of Discipline based on their context and culture(s).

Currently, there are 7 Central Conferences — which are the regional bodies outside of the United States. They will become regional conferences. Now the United States will becomes a regional conference. The 8 regional conferences will be: Africa, Congo, West Africa, Central & southern Europe, Germany, Northern Europe & Eurasia, Philippines, and the United States.

A regional conference can establish a regional Book of Discipline, set standards and qualifications for clergy and specialized lay ministers, publish a regional hymnal with adapted ritual, and adapt structures for missional contexts. The United States Regional Conference will continue to be organized into 5 Jurisdictions. The Western North Carolina Conference is a part of the Southeastern Jurisdiction.

The regions cannot alter bodies that serve the entire denomination, such as the General Conference, a Judicial Council, the Council of Bishops, and General Boards and Agencies. And we will continue to share one Constitution with the same Doctrinal Standards (Articles of Religion and Confession of Faith), Our Theological Task, Christian Ministry and Social Principles. These are not adaptable by regional conferences. They will still be subject to this same process of revision that we are going through now. Perhaps most importantly, our Wesleyan theological doctrine and identity will remain a constant.

This is an historic moment. The democratic, Spirit-led process that took place across the world was brought forward by the Committee on Central Conference Matters in continuity with the Council of Bishops, the Commission on a Way Forward, the work of successive General Conferences, discernment at every level of the church, and the love for Christ, the church and the world that is represented by the Cross and the Flame. I give thanks to God today for this good news and am honored to share it with you as your Bishop.
